

Significant notes

- Tsavo Trust acknowledged in research paper titled "Wildlife roadkill in the Tsavo Ecosystem, Kenya: identifying hotspots, potential drivers, and affected species" (F. Lala & J. Bump). TT has fed into this research over the last 7 years, and as a team have documenting thousands of road killed wildlife.
- Makueni Development Trust (MADET): Since January 2022 Tsavo Trust was chosen to support and help operationalize MADET with seed funding from USAid through the Aga Khan Foundation (EA) Yetu Initiative. This is a key development project for Makueni County.






Aerial Reconnaissance and Ground Patrols - Areas Covered:



- Aerial patrolling is a vital conservation tool providing "eyes in the skies" and directional guidance to ground units who provide "eyes and ears" on the ground. The combination of both is effective.
- ➤ All flight paths and ground patrols are carried out jointly KWS/TT and recorded with all relevant real-time observations relayed to KWS daily for rapid actions and for their records.

Map shows Tsavo Trust's flight paths in RED and ground patrol paths in GREEN over the TCA this month.

Note: The Tsavo Parks are huge comprising 22,000km² (TENP, TWNP & CHNP) and then a further 20,000km² totaling 42,000km² to form the Tsavo Conservation Area (TCA).

Aerial: 55 hours flown covering 6,343 kilometers over Tsavo in support of KWS.

Ground: 959 kilometers of foot patrol and a further 17,911 kilometers of vehicle patrol in Tsavo to support KWS.

Activities cover: Air & ground security patrols; Big Tusker monitoring; Rhino related activities; Locating illegal activities; Wildlife monitoring; Aerial census and telemetry tracking as well as Community Conservancy aerial and ground activities.

This is a joint KWS / Tsavo Trust project to raise rhino awareness and revenue generation for rhino.



Field Mobile Units:

Tembo 1, 3, 5, 7 teams, Kamungi & Shirango Scouts are habitat protection / de-snaring focused.

Tembo 2 (TENP) & 4 (TWNP) teams are wildlife monitoring dedicated.

All teams work alongside KWS daily and provide further "eyes and ears in the field".
